Definitions

- “Number of Student who began Program” means the number of students who began a program who are scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who canceled during the cancellation period.
- “Students Available for Graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- “Number of On-Time Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- “On-Time Completion Rate” is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for Graduation.
- “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for Graduation.
- “Graduates Available for Employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- “Graduates unavailable for Employment” means graduates who, after Graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau approved postsecondary institution.
- “Graduates employed in the Field” means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- “Placement Rate Employment in the Field” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- “Number of Students Taking Exam” is the number of students who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- “First Available Exam Date” is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.



- "Pass Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- "Number who Passed First Available Exam" is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- "Salary" is as reported by the graduate or graduate's employer.
- "No Salary Information reported" is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.



“STUDENTS RIGHT TO CANCEL”

Institution’s cancellation disclosure from the Enrollment Agreement

1. You have the right to cancel your Agreement for a program of instruction, without any penalty or obligations, through attendance at the first class session or the seventh calendar day after enrollment, whichever is later. After the end of the cancellation period, you also have the right to stop school at any time; and you have the right to receive a pro-rata refund if you have completed 60 percent or less of the scheduled days in the current payment period in your program through the last day of attendance.

2. Cancellation may occur when the student provides written notice of cancellation to Randa Thurman, CPE, Director or Robert F. Von Essen, CPE, Asst. Director at the following address:

Delivery of the notice can be done by mail or by hand delivery.
3. The written notice of cancellation, if sent by mail, is valid when deposited in the mail adequately addressed with proper postage.
4. The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and, however, expressed; it is effective if it shows that the student no longer wishes to be bound by the Enrollment Agreement.
5. If the Enrollment Agreement is canceled, the school will refund the student any money he/she paid, less a registration or administration fee not to exceed \$250.00, and less any deduction for equipment not returned in good condition within 45 days of withdrawal. Textbooks, tools, and supplies issued and accepted by the student are non-refundable if used or removed from the original packaging.

It is important that you keep copies of the enrollment agreement, financial papers, receipts, or any other information that documents the monies paid to the Institute.
